### 6. Approval of Minutes January 10, 2016

MOTION CARRIED (Eknoian/Glimme): To approve the meeting minutes of the January 10, 2017 P&O Committee Meeting with change as noted above. The motion was approved unanimously.

### 7. Public Comment

Eknoian noted thatewasdisappointed ast yearthata dedicated SEP fund to serve African American students was not created as it's the one group with the largest gap in achievement He felt Rtl<sup>2</sup> was the nearest hing to a source of money to help them His questions were: How many students are served? How many of them are of color? Is there anyway to track where they were prior to intervention and where they were after the intervention? The model for him was the LLI program where the Lit Coach could tell what any student was doing in terms of their progress through the reading levels. Rtl<sup>2</sup> has been around since t least the 2006 version of the Measure yet after 11 years there is still an enormous gap. He felt this was a place to exercise oversight.

Karamstated hatthey haveto havean adopted budgety June30th of the prior yearand therby statute, the budgethas to be revised by October 3<sup>st</sup> and Januar 91<sup>st</sup>. The First Interim reflects who has been hired and refine scosts. She encourage duestions. Although they are working on the Second Interimow, notall the budgets have been revised. The onesthat have had the most activity are the onesthat get the first pass revision. Howeveall the budgets will be revised by time of the Second Interim Report.

Karamand Beeryprovided the following handouts:

• Comparison of Measure A and Measure 1 Frameworks, April 2016 Projections

Beerystated that the numberson the Comparison of Measure A and Measure 1 Frameworks, April 2016 Projections had not been revised. This handout compare the structure and budgets for the measures Shenoted under Measure, the revenue for 2016-17 wa\$16M, and the expenses were \$18.1 Mending with a shortfall of \$1.87 M. This was where the GF stepped into carry those expenses, but his could not be sustained or more than two years. The rewas an expectation that the new measure would be structured n such a way that BSEP would be ble to carry those expenses or equivalent once again. It was also looked at how the various pieces related to each other and what kind of flexibility the District should have one etstudent needs across time.

Class SizeReduction and associated osts continueto bethe primarygoal of the new measure, receiving 66% of the total revenue under the framework of "High Quality Instruction." The CSR/High Quality Instruction budgets madeup of two pages." Page 1" being the CSR Teacher Templatecosts, and any money left over become "Page 2" or what was referred to Measure A as Middle SchoolCounseling, Expanded Cour Set Ferrings/ECO and Program Support. In the new measure Middle SchoolCounseling was moved to Effective Student Support (must archolored box) and most of what fell under Program Support (such as Lit Coache and RtI) are now part of "Student Achievement Strategies" in that same section.

Beerysaidthat Scuderiwould first bebringing a plan for BSEP's larges expenditure, which the CSR budget and the pieces that go along with it, at the next meeting. Shortly after, Scuderiwill bring a plan for the Student Support Section.

Questions and responses:

Responding a question about what the final fund balance for this year would be, Karam thought the rewould be a closes crutiny of it for the Second Interimeport at the beginning of March, especially around what washappening with the CSR Teacher Transfer and the amount of the transfer. Beery noted that ny remaining funds must be spentin accordance with the previous measure Karam confirmed there would be a new fund for the new measure Beery said the purposes between the measure **s** nostly align and added that funds left over from the 1994 measure were finally spential system.

Beeryconfirmed tha BSEP is structured so hat each specific resource has an allocation such as the Library resource and each year the budget manage would present plan as to how these funds would be best used to meet the needs of kids. Beerys aid the new measure was written not just from the perspective of a blank check of "money for the schools," but that the District would pomise to do some specific things, but with some flexibility for how it carries out those things. BUSD will have musicand libraries, for example, but he manager scome up with ideas on how to carry out each of those things and bring these proposals to the P&O and ultimately to the Board.

Beery stated that PatSaddler, Director of Programs and Specia Projects, would be coming to the P&O committee mostly likely in March to talk about LCAP funds and where the funding intersections are. Simon stated that the Committee had senstrongly worded recommendations the Board in the past, which resulted inchanges Beery stated that the budget managers are thinking about the P&O Committee when they are putting their planstoge ther an inviting the members to the subcommittee meetings. She also frequently hears managers concerned about what the P&O Committee will think about a proposal.

Scudersaidhe and the Ed Service steamhave been talking about developing goals for this particular budge and want to continue to do alot of what they're doing new, creative and positive. They also want to be thought ful about the finances of all their considerations othat in the long run they don't get into trouble with a great idea that lasts two to three years and ther has to be squeezed to where it is not recognizable nymore. There are lot of things they would like to continue and acknowledge there is room for improvements and modifications. He noted that under HighQuality Instruction, Profession Development was extremely fortunate to have a concurrent mount of funding from designate deneral funds for the implementation of Common Core and Next Generation Science Standards/NGSS and other forms of curriculum.

Scuderistated that when the LCAP Plan was approved, there were specific purpose and recommendations, like / 6 FTE in Rtl<sup>2</sup> in all the K-5 sites, that were predetermined.
